

Lily Allen Alright Still Rock Music CD Review

The exceptionally talented Rock artist Lily Allen has released her CD entitled Alright, Still. I am very confident and happy to announce that I believe Lily Allen fans, and Rock fans alike will be pleased with this one. With the release of Alright, Still Lily Allen's artistic excellence is on full display as Allen has once again delivered a brilliant collection of tracks that could very well be her best work to date.

This CD will grab your attention right from the very beginning with Smile and won't let go until the very last note of the very last song Smile, which is another great track by the way.

Alright, Still has a pleasantly varied, mix of 13 tracks that are very well written songs by this clearly superb artist. Most of the songs display a lot of the kind emotion that makes for a really great listen. Seemingly drawing from what I can only imagine are her own real life experiences. At different points touching on the most real emotions like love, and the pain of failed relationships can certainly be heard.

I'm of the opinion that Alright, Still is certainly Lily Allen's best work in a few years. A totally enjoyable CD and an outstanding release. What I call must have music. I give it two thumbs up because it's a collection that even the casual Rock fan can appreciate and enjoy.

While the entire album is really very good the truly standout tunes are track 2 - Knock Em Out, track 4 - Everything's Just Wonderful, and track 9 - Take What You Take.
